History of Dragon Boat

Dragon Boating has its roots in Chinese tradition and culture. The event is said to have originated over 2000-years ago, from the actions of the great Chinese poet and philosopher, Qu Yuan, who committed suicide in the river Mei Lo, as a protest against the political corruption of the day. To commemorate this sacrifice the people began to organize Dragon Boat Races in his memory.

Each boat symbolizes a dragon, hence the name dragon boating. The Dragon has a very symbolic meaning for the Chinese. With its strength and power the Dragon rides the clouds in the sky and commands the wind, mist and rain. The boats have dragon heads for bows, and dragon tails for sterns. The paddles symbolically represent the claws.



Description of The Dragon Boat



In Dragon Boat Racing there are generally 18-20 paddlers per Standard size Dragon Boat and 8-10 paddlers in the Small boat, plus a drummer and a steerer (helm). The boats are raced in distance of 200, 500 or 1000 meters in sport racing, or up to even greater distances in traditional festivals. Not only are strength, endurance and skill important but teamwork and harmony of purpose. There is no other paddle sport in which 22 people work together to create a team result rewarded through the efforts of the whole crew, rather than a few individual performances.

Competitive and Festival Racing

Dragon boat racing falls into two categories: **The Competitive racing** and **The Festival (Recreational) racing**. Competitive racing is done by highly trained, elite club and national teams. However, Festival racing has been developed for recreational training and racing championships or events, which gather a large number of people who just want to socialize, have fun and enjoy the many excitements the sport has to offer. A big factor contributing to dragon boating's popularity is the fact that a crew can very quickly become competitive, without prior knowledge of the sport itself or any other relative paddle sport. Many crews that take part in these recreational events come from community groups, company groups or other organizations, and they participate to achieve greater group unity, to sharpen their team spirit, or simply to get a better opportunity to socialize.
